

FILIPPO DI MAURO

Filippo di Mauro is a leading economic expert on productivity and international competitiveness of countries and firms. He is currently Professor of Economics at the Business School at the National University of Singapore and consultant for the Monetary Authority of Singapore, the Economic Development Board of Singapore and the World Bank.



He has more than 30 years of experience in international organizations and central banks. He worked for the Asian Development Bank, the International Monetary Fund, the Bank of Italy, the European Central Bank and the US Federal Reserve.

Filippo di Mauro joined the European Central Bank in 1998 and was heading the division in charge of global economics. From 2011 to 2016, he was a Senior Advisor in the Research Department of the ECB.

He is the founder and chairman of CompNet, the leading network on productivity research in Europe. CompNet is a joint effort of central banks and EU institutions to understand how firm productivity changes in the era of digitalization and integrated global value chains. Recently he has founded an Asian productivity network.

He frequently gives talks to a broad audience on globalization, international competitiveness, trade wars, global value chains and the productivity of firms in an interconnected world.
