First World War Centenary

In 2014, the Central Bank of Malta issued a numismatic coin in silver and in brass commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the commencement of the First World War.

The obverse of the coin shows the emblem of Malta with the year of issue 2014.

The reverse features a nurse administering medication to a wounded soldier. This recalls the humanitarian role that Malta played during the First World War with its 27 hospitals and convalescent camps, where thousands of casualties of the war were treated. The reverse of the coin also features a soldier and a red-coloured poppy which is the evocative symbol of remembrance of all soldiers who died in the conflict. This is the first time that colour was used on a Maltese coin.

Ten years of the euro in Malta

On 9 May 2018, the Central Bank of Malta issued a numismatic coin to commemorate ten years since Malta adopted the euro.

The reverse of the coins carries a stylised representation of 'Malta' and 'Europa' meant to symbolise Malta's currency transition from the Maltese lira to euro in 2008. The obverse of the coin features the coat of arms of Malta.

When Malta became an EU member state on 1 May 2004 the country was committed to join the (FRQPLFDQ ORZDU\8QRQ and adopt the single European currency. To be able to do this Malta had to fulfil a number of conditions concerning the stability of public finances, prices, interest rates and the exchange rate. Malta adopted the euro on 1 January 2008.

250th Anniversary of the University of Malta

To mark the 250th anniversary of its founding in 1769, the University of Malta teamed up with the Central Bank of Malta to issue two commemorative coins.

The coins show the ceremonial crest of the University of Malta including the Latin inscription "Ut Fructificemus Deo", as well as the period being commemorated while the reverse side depicts the Republic of Malta's coat of arms.
